



UNSC Resolution 1325

CENDDOW supports the ideals of UNSC Resolutions on gender, conflicts, and mediation. So far, the situations of denial and exclusion of women have gained the recognition and practical actions of governance actors in the international community. We are witnessing new international agreements that aim at creating standards of norms.

CENDDOW is committed to ensuring the inclusion and participation of women in processes through the pronouncement of UNSC Resolution 1325. Typically, we promote the goals of the Dutch government NAP 1325 through our strategic partnership in WO=MEN forum. We have devoted our resources in the implementation of NAP programmes in Sudan and also, we are actively creating awareness within the community of African women's associations, both in the Netherlands and in African countries.

Role of Women

Many cultures include the Africans, refer to women generally as mothers. This defines the nature of responsibility and expectation the society apportioned to the female gender. Failure on the importance of this responsibility will have devastating consequences in the society.

The role women play in ensuring good upbringing of the succeeding generation is important and exceptional. This impact on the level of expressed juvenile delinquencies and the security of our community as well as performance in school, to mention a few. This can be of immense challenge for women in circumstances of single motherhood. CENDDOW key roles in support of the roles of mother is directed at the following:

- Creating awareness of situations and available instruments from the national and international environments of events.
- We also commit to building the knowledge capacity of women's associations.

Community Welfare

The African migrant community in the Netherlands remains the least informed and integrated; hence the most disadvantaged. The social, economic, and political participation of this minority community is not only worrisome but remains unrecognized. It is for this purpose the CENDDOW initiated the DIASPOINT project in 2016.

The DIASPOINT project has offered practical media space through which the target community can be seen, informed and be heard.

Through the DIASPOINT social platform, we are increasing participation in several national activities in the Netherlands such as, Covid-19 vaccinations, the right to vote and be voted for, the importance of burial insurance and Organ Donation.
